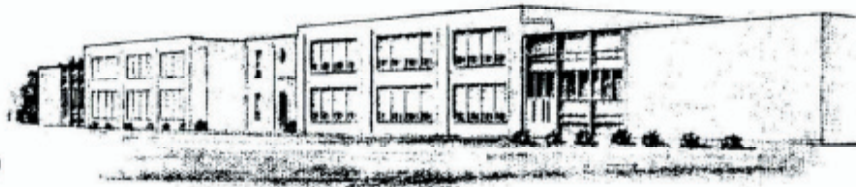

From the Desk of Geoff Palmer, Superintendent

The groundbreaking ceremony for the new school was held November 22. The entire student body as well as community members, local government officials, business owners, alumni, former employees and board members were present. The band and choir were on hand to perform the National Anthem, the Fight Song and the Alma Mater, making this day a memorable one!

Despite the winter weather settling in, our contractors continue to keep the project on schedule. The project schedule will soon be posted in the school offices. Feel free to take a look if you are in the building. Work completed to date includes: Footings for all building sections except for the kitchen, which is about half completed. Foundation block is now completed for three areas of the building. Work also continues on the underground water tank that is a required part of the fire suppression system. Good news associated with these tasks is that we have not encountered any further issues, so far, with "unsuitable soil" or quicksand. As mentioned in the last newsletter, the south parking areas required the use of some of the project contingency funds to stabilize those areas. With only a couple of small areas yet remaining for underground work, we hope to avoid any further issues.

Regarding the project finances, we are on budget and moving forward using the project funding methods recommended by our bond underwriters and agreed to by the Board of Education. By using the funding selected, we were able to finance the entire project at around 2.9% interest, saving the district's taxpayers about \$8 million in interest. We truly have a great deal and will have a great building in the fall of 2013!

2011 Income Tax Filing

Now that you've been having income taxes taken out of your paycheck all year, it is time to file your taxes! When you fill out your State of Ohio income tax form, you will now need to fill out an additional form (SDIT SD100 – School District Income Tax). You can access the form with this link: http://tax.ohio.gov/divisions/school_district_income/documents/2011_SDIT_SD100_Final_2011_FS_101211.pdf, or simply Google “State of Ohio school district income tax form” and you should get this form to come up. You can get the instructions at: http://tax.ohio.gov/divisions/school_district_income/documents/2011_PIT_IT1040_Booklet_Final_2011_FS_112911.pdf#page=55. For your convenience, we will have several forms and booklets in the Board office if you need a copy. Additionally, you can email me and I can send you a link to these forms. My email is vrehart@hlschool.org. When you are filling out this form, there are three very important pieces of information to know.

First, our school district code is **7403**.

Second, our tax rate is .5% (half of one percent), and

Third, we are an EARNED INCOME TAX district, NOT a traditional income tax.

This tax is like all other taxes – you MUST file and pay your taxes if you live within Hopewell-Loudon school district. Audits are made by the tax department cross-checking addresses with school districts to be sure that all district residents file the appropriate taxes. If you have questions, please see your tax advisor to help you complete your forms. Remember to tell them the above 3 items when they are filling your form out.

As far as our building project, we are still on budget financially, and we are on target, also, on our timelines for completion! Hopefully we will see some walls going up this spring!

Leader Alert® Parent Notification System

Just a reminder that Hopewell-Loudon School continues to use the Leader Alert® system which delivers mass voice, texting, and email messages. This message alert system will be utilized in the event of school delays, cancellations, emergencies or as a way to share other important information. If you are the parent of a student in grades K-12, your contact information on file at school will be used for voice mail notification to your home phone. It is important to keep the offices updated with any changes to your contact information.

If you would like to add additional means of contact:

- log on to www.leaderalert.com/hlschool
- create your secure account
- you may add up to 3 additional phone numbers with text messaging or voicemail options
- you may also enter an email address if you wish to be notified electronically

When you receive a phone call from the Leader Alert system:

- answer and say hello, speak loudly
- be sure to wait a few moments (up to 5 seconds) for the message to begin, if there is background noise where you are, the message may not play right away
- follow the instructions given on the phone to acknowledge the call

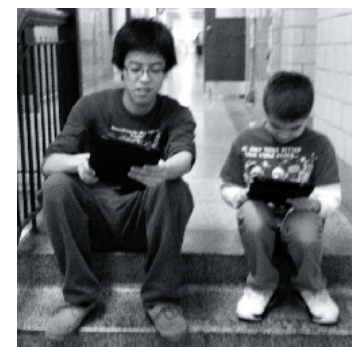
It is already the beginning of the second semester and the Technology Department at Hopewell-Loudon has been really busy. Mobile devices are making a big impact in the business world and we in education are trying to keep pace. Over break we installed our own enterprise wireless at the Jr/Sr High School end of the building in order handle the increased load of mobile devices so the Jr/Sr High can do further classroom evaluation and policy development. These enterprise access points will be transferred to the non-academic areas of the new campus in 2013 so we can have full campus coverage.

We replaced aging laptops in the elementary cart with iPads. In our recent presentations at BGSU and recent classroom testing of mobile devices the Apple iOS devices proved to be the most reliable educational mobile devices for the primary grade levels. Since a lot of elementary students do not have mobile devices this will help provide teachers with a tool to obtain collective assessments and a fun way to use the many educational apps available for the iPad.

Evidence shows me that a lot of you in the community are using more mobile devices. If you own such a device and would like some tips and how to use them, I will be hosting a free training session here at H-L:

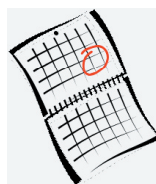
