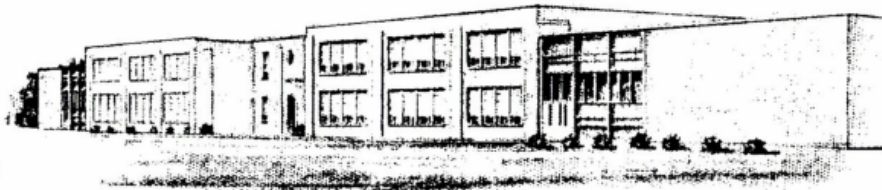

H1N1 Influenza Update

Your Local Health Department, in conjunction with the State Department of Health and the CDC have been actively communicating on issues related to the H1N1 Influenza.

What You Can Do To Stay Healthy

- **Stay informed.** The CDC website, www.cdc.gov, will be updated regularly as information becomes available. Influenza is thought to **spread mainly person-to-person** through coughing or sneezing of infected people.
- **Take everyday actions to stay healthy.**
 1. Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Throw the tissue in the trash after you use it. If no tissue is available cough or sneeze into your elbow or shoulder.
 2. Wash your hands often with soap and water, especially after you cough or sneeze. Alcohol-based hand cleaners are also effective.
 3. Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth. Germs spread that way.
 4. Stay home if you get sick. If you or your child develops a temperature 100 degrees or higher, the CDC recommends that the individual stay home from work or school and limit contact with others to keep from infecting them, until the fever is gone for 24 hours without the use of acetaminophen (Tylenol) or ibuprofen (Motrin or Advil).
- **Follow public health advice** regarding school closures, avoiding crowds and follow other social distancing measures.
- **Develop a family emergency plan** as a precaution. This should include storing a supply of food, medications, facemasks, alcohol-based hand rubs and other essential supplies.

From the Desk of Geoff Palmer, Superintendent

Greetings!

As election day quickly rolls around, I wanted to share with you some important facts about our district's issues on the ballot. More information is also available at www.HL70More.com.

Proposed Bond Issue

The district's first ballot issue is a 2.18 mill bond issue (property tax) to raise funds for the construction of a fixed seat auditorium and new athletic stadium. For the past seventy years our auditorium has been a tremendous source of pride for the community and, based on last year's community forums, it was important to consider building a similar auditorium along with any new construction. The Ohio School Facilities Commission (OSFC) only funds combination auditorium/cafeterias like Tiffin Middle School or Seneca East, so the funding for this project would be all local monies.

As for the stadium, we all have seen the number of times that facility has been flooded from fall through spring. Since the field and track are in a flood plain, there is not much we can do to alleviate the problems. This regular flooding also makes it impossible for us to make any improvements to our track, forcing all track events except the Dick Schultz Relays to be held at our opponents' facilities.

Proposed Income Tax and Bond Issue

The second item appearing on the ballot is a .5% *Earned Income Tax* and a 5.98 mill bond issue (property tax). An *Earned Income Tax* is paid ONLY on income earned through working. Retirement, investment, rental and similar incomes will not be taxed. Similarly, unemployment compensation will not be taxed.

The input received at last year's Community Forums showed strong support for a combination income tax and property tax. From that, the Board of Education decided the *Earned Income Tax* and property tax combination allowed an equitable sharing of the costs of construction that also places more responsibility on those community members who will have students in the new school.

Questions

The Board is aware of several key questions surrounding this proposed building project:

- Why was new construction selected over renovation?
- Why build now in tough economic times?
- Why are we building for open enrollment students?

Rest assured there has been much discussion of these, and many other questions. In 1938 the members of the Hopewell-Loudon community were faced with a similarly difficult decision and decided to build for the future—the future we have all enjoyed.

Community Meeting

If you want to hear discussion of these key questions and any other discussion related to the bond issue, there will be a Community Meeting to discuss the ballot issues on Wednesday, October 28 at 7:00 p.m. in the auditorium. Members of the Planning Committee, Board of Education and administration will be there to share thoughts and answer your questions. Please mark this date on your calendar so you can get the facts on the proposed project.

Students of the Month

Congratulations to Katie Hale and Matt Heater for being selected as the September Students of the Month. Both Katie and Matt were nominated by Mrs. Jackie Parkins for their excellent attitudes and contributions to the classroom and to the school.

ACT Prep Class

On October 19 & 22, students from Hopewell-Loudon High School, along with students from Seneca and Wyandot County schools, participated in ACT Prep classes offered by our teachers. Students received instruction that will better prepare them for the ACT. If any student is interested in spring dates, please contact our guidance counselor, Mrs. Herr.

Bullying Prevention Presentation

On October 7th with the cooperation of The Seneca County Family & Children First Council, Jim Bisineus presented strategies and body-language techniques to eliminate verbal, physical, and social bullying. This training taught students the dance between kids who bully, and those they are targeting. After school, Jim presented information to staff on how to detect bullying and how to stop it from occurring. During the evening parents were shown what dynamics create bully and victim behaviors. They also learned how to help their children not become and/or remain a member of the victimized group. The group focused on practical things parents can do at home to support their children. The techniques include specific role-playing and body language training exercises for kids being targeted.

Internet Safety Training

On November 10th students, staff and parents will be presented with strategies to keep students safe while using the internet at school and at home. The iSafe program is a nationwide program developed to help protect children from dangers sometimes encountered when using technology. Hopewell-Loudon will welcome presenters from the Ohio Attorney General's office on November 10 to speak with students, staff and parents in four assemblies. High school students will begin the afternoon with a presentation on technology use safety and appropriate behavior on technology with an emphasis on sexual content and self protection. The 5-8 grade assembly will cover key steps to safety while using technology and avoidance of cyber bullies. The final, and key, presentation is offered to parents and will address how you can protect children from cyber issues. Children may have a greater level of comfort on technology but it is up to parents to be aware of threats that arise with the tools that youth use. The program begins at 7:00 and will arm attendees with information to protect and assist their children in safe, appropriate use of technology.

On November 16, 18, and 24 from 5:00-8:30 pm, and on November 25 from 8:00-12:00 we will be holding conferences with parents. Parent Advisory Committee

The Parent Advisory committee continues to meet to provide a positive means of communication between parents and the school. Throughout the school year the group will discuss topics that will make positive improvements in the education of our students.
